Summer is in full swing, and we at Camellia Chapter hope you are enjoying every bit of it. Our last meeting was Friendship Night,



August 14: Stated Meeting. It's Brother's Night! Brothers will serve Refreshments at 6:15pm. Our Meeting starts at 7:30pm.


