
I hope everyone has been enjoying their summer. As we get closer to fall it is time to start looking out for all the students headed back to school. Drive Safe.



Theme: "Autumn and Activity", with a donation of non-perishable food items to be donated to the Rescue Mission is being requested. We will play games afterwards.


October 5 & 6- Medieval Faire Fundraiser Booth (Further information will be provided upon return of the school who is sponsoring the event and which has been out for Summer.)
