Dear Masonic family and Brethren,

October is a month that has been decreed in January by our Grand Master as "First Re-

sponder Month". How appropriate this decree mirrors the current situation with the pandemic and wildfires - indeed we should be recognizing the dangers inherent with this profession. Concurrently, we as masons can assist our fellow masons and their families that are impacted by the pandemic and wildfires by donating to the Masonic Foundation (www.masonicfoundation.org) in any capacity you can. October 10th and 11th is also the 171st Annual Communication of Grand Lodge. Add in the word "virtual" and you know this year has been "unique". In the California Freemason magazine, 'The NOIR Issue', on the inside first page you will find the information ALL Master Masons can register and attend the event- virtually. It is important to register with the new iMember 2.0 in order to attend. Today, I see only eighteen Humboldt 79 Master Masons that have re-registered with iMember 2.0 (13% of our membership). An important issue being proposed by the Grand Master at this communication is amendment of section 807.00 and 807.010 regarding stated and special meeting emergency protocols. If passed, this will allow Humboldt 79 to hold a virtual election of next year's officers on November 5th. Details will be provided henceforth.

Since our Hiram ceremony for Brother Bill McBroome has been delayed indefinitely, I presented him the Hiram Award and letter from the Grand Master at his residence with my wife Janis and our Senior Deacon Jim Briggs. We still have plans to hold a Lodge event to honor this accolade when we are able.

Our Lodge sponsors the military banner project on the boardwalk and I've included a photo of the Smith family receiving the banner and it's posting. The posting was a special request made by the family we were honored to accommodate. This program has been going strong since 2015 and is very appreciated by the recipients and their families. We also provide the banner to the recipient when their military service is completed.

We have informed our candidates and prospects who are in a holding pattern that we haven't forgotten them! We aim to hold a virtual information night this month chaired by our Senior Warden to answer questions and provide information.

History Continued

In one case is found that a fund was collected to send a sick member back to his home in the East. Another where the Lodge paid the monthly grocery bill of a member's widow over quite a long period. A number of times the Lodge paid for a team and hearse at a funeral and in a number of cases is found where the Lodge paid for the coffin. Another instance where a bill for a hat and three yards of crepe was allowed. Again in 1875 we find where Brother A. P. Guthrie was taken seriously ill near Camp Grant up the Eel River. A committee was appointed to assist him and W. B. Dobbyn succeeded in making the trip up the river where he purchased a boat and brought the sick brother down the river and then to Rohnerville where he later died. In another case we find a certain sum of money voted to help defray the expense a member's wife to the asylum. At the next meeting the brethren evidently decided that this was not proper to appear in the minutes and the purpose for which the money was to be used for was ordered to be stricken from the minutes. These are just a few of the incidents selected from the records at random.

That the officers were interested in becoming proficient in their Masonic duties we learn from the records of a meeting held on December 15, 1866, wherein it was reported that arrangements had been made with Brother Bull of Arcata to come to Rohnerville to teach the officers their work, for which he was to be paid the sum of \$75.00 and receive his board and room while so doing

On June 4, 1870, this Lodge participated with Humboldt Lodge No. 79 in Eureka in laying the cornerstone of their new temple in Eureka and then we find that on June 1873, just three years later, the lodge again met with Humboldt Lodge No 79 for the purpose of dedicating their new temple. The temple was afterwards sold to another organization and later destroyed by fire. In July of 1870, sawdust was ordered placed between the walls and under the floors of the meeting place at Rohnerville and other steps taken to prevent eavesdroppers from listening in on the proceedings of the Lodge. I find an account of a Masonic celebration held in Rohnerville on St. Johns Day, June 1874, in which the procession was headed by the Rohnerville Coronet Band and Myrtle Lodge of Perfection was the escort. Brother S. N. Buck was the orator of the day. Evidently, Rohnerville must have sported a band in those days. I have not been able to learn anything of Myrtle Lodge of Perfection or where it was located.

In 1877, several brethren attempted to form another lodge at Hydesville, but this Lodge evidently refused to recommend a dispensation. Also in those times Rohnerville must have supported a newspaper for it is recorded that this Lodge carried it's card in the Rohnerville Herald.
