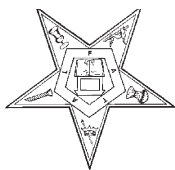

This month there will be an All Member Instructional which will be held on Saturday, January 22nd in Sebastopol and there will be one on Sunday, January 23rd in Los Molinos.

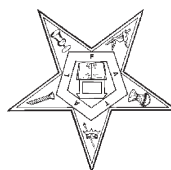

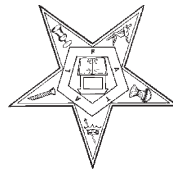
It is encouraging to see some new officers in the line for the ensuing year. They will bring fresh ideas and energy into the line. Thank you for serving.

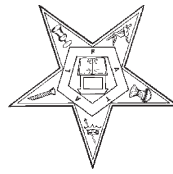
